**WELCOME!**

We are happy to have you with us today! We pray that you will be blessed by God's Word while you are here, and that you will leave with the peace of his devoted love for you, the forgiveness of your sins, and the promise of eternal life. If we can serve you in any way, please let us know!

**WE'RE GLAD YOU BROUGHT YOUR CHILDREN!** Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these." (Matthew 19:14) We know that having little children in church can be a challenge. Don't worry; many of your fellow worshippers have been in your shoes. We reserve the last two pews on either side for parents with young children. We also provide children's bulletins with fun activities that help keep little folks occupied and learning. If you need to take your child out of church, you can go outside the sanctuary, where you will still be able to hear and observe the worship service. There is also a "Quiet Room" to your right as you exit the sanctuary. Your fellow worshippers are happy that you have your children at worship, but also appreciate your sensitivity to how a fussing child or loud playing can make it difficult to concentrate during worship.

In our 10:30 a.m. worship service we provide child care in our classroom space (down the hall to the left as you exit the sanctuary) from following the Children's Lesson until the end of the service so parents can focus on the message for the day. When dropping off your child, please let the adult in charge that week know where you are located in the church in case the provider needs to come and get you for any reason. Parents are also asked to come and pick up your children right after church is over, please don't wait to be ushered out. Thank you.

**PLEASE SIGN THE PEW REGISTER** located at the end of each row. Members may simply sign and check "member" and also "communing", if applicable today. Sign and check "regularly attending non-member" if that applies to you and check "communing today" if that applies. Visitors are asked to check "visitor" and any of the other columns, which may apply and fill out a "Guest Card" located in the pew register and return it to the box in the narthex (*hanging on the wall to the left as you exit*). Member families are reminded to sign one line per confirmed member.

**RESTROOMS AND CHANGING TABLE**

Restrooms are in the education/fellowship area. Head left as you exit the sanctuary and take a left at the end of the hallway. A changing table is located in the "Quiet Room."

**DISABILITY ASSISTANCE**

Large print worship materials and large print hymnals are together and available in the maroon colored binders on the ushers stand or ask an usher for assistance. A "loop system" provides amplification of the service sent directly to enabled hearing aids. Open spaces are provided throughout the sanctuary for those using wheelchairs.

## THE OLD TESTAMENT LESSON: ISAIAH 61:1-6

The Spirit of the LORD God is upon me,  
because the LORD has anointed me  
to preach good news to the afflicted.  
He sent me to bind up the brokenhearted,  
to proclaim freedom for the captives  
and release for those who are bound,  
<sup>2</sup>to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor  
and the day of vengeance for our God,  
to comfort all who mourn,  
<sup>3</sup>to provide for those who mourn in Zion,  
to give them a crown of beauty instead of ashes,  
the oil of joy instead of mourning, *continued....*

**Lesson Notes:**

*Isaiah (an Israelite prophet from the early 700s) foretold the destruction of Jerusalem and the exile of God's chosen people as a result of their rejection of the Lord, but also their return from exile. He also foretold the greatest deliverance of all- salvation from sin and death- through the promised Savior. Here, Isaiah records the Savior's own words about what he would come to do, and the impact of his mission: the uniting of Jews and Gentiles (called "foreigners" and "nations" here) in the Christian Church.*

**For Personal Consideration Or Family Discussion:**

*Consider what the promised Savior says he will do when he comes. Then think about/discuss what draws people to Jesus. Consider also what the promised Savior says about how Gentiles (like you and me) will help build the Christian church by using their talents and wealth to bring the gospel to others. What opportunities do you have here in this church or beyond to do just that?*

**THE VERSE OF THE DAY**

P: Alleluia. Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching, preaching, and healing every disease. Alleluia. (*Matthew 4:23 cf. NIV*)

**THE EPISTLE LESSON: 1 CORINTHIANS 12:12-21, 26, 27**

<sup>12</sup>For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so also is Christ. <sup>13</sup>For by one Spirit we all were baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free people, and we were all caused to drink one Spirit. <sup>14</sup>Furthermore, the body is not one member, but many. <sup>15</sup>If the foot says, "Because I am not a hand, I am not part of the body," it does not on that account cease to be part of the body. <sup>16</sup>If the ear says, "Because I am not an eye, I am not part of the body," it does not on that account cease to be part of the body. <sup>17</sup>If the whole body were an eye, where would the sense of hearing be? If the whole body were an ear, where would the sense of smell be? <sup>18</sup>But now God has arranged the members in the body, each and every one of them, as he desired. <sup>19</sup>If they were all one member, where would the body be? <sup>20</sup>But as it is, there are many members, yet one body.

<sup>21</sup>The eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need for you," or again the head to the feet, "I have no need for you."

<sup>26</sup>So if one member suffers, all the members suffer with it, or if one member is honored, all the members rejoice with it.

<sup>27</sup>You are the body of Christ, and individually you are members of it.

**Lesson Notes:**

Paul describes the sum total of believers in Jesus as “the body of Christ.” Christ serves us by uniting us in faith in him so we can help, support, and serve each other. Like the various parts of a human body each have an important function that benefits the entire body, so also each of us are uniquely placed and gifted by God in the body of Christ for our mutual benefit as we serve each other.

**For Personal Consideration Or Family Discussion:**

This lesson reminds us of our unity as believers in Jesus. What can threaten that unity...in our culture? In the attitudes and actions of believers you are connected to? In you? How does Christ work in us the right attitudes and actions so we keep loving, forgiving, appreciating, and serving each other?

**THE GOSPEL LESSON: LUKE 4:14-21** (Please stand)

<sup>14</sup>Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news about him spread through all the surrounding area. <sup>15</sup>He was teaching in their synagogues and being honored by everyone.


<sup>16</sup>He went to Nazareth, where he had been brought up. As was his custom, he went into the synagogue on the Sabbath day and stood up to read. <sup>17</sup>The scroll of the prophet Isaiah was handed to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written:

<sup>18</sup>The Spirit of the Lord is on me,  
because he anointed me to preach good news to the poor.  
He has sent me to proclaim freedom to the captives  
and recovery of sight to the blind,  
to set free those who are oppressed,

<sup>19</sup>and to proclaim the year of the Lord’s favor.

<sup>20</sup>He rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant, and sat down. The eyes of everyone in the synagogue were fastened on him. <sup>21</sup>He began to tell them, “Today, this Scripture is fulfilled in your hearing.”

**Lesson Notes:**

Two weeks ago we learned that the Holy Spirit came upon Jesus at his baptism. We see the power of Jesus in his powerful message: The good news that God has come to show his grace (favor) and set his people free from the tyranny of sin, guilt, death, hell and the devil. Good news embodied in Jesus himself!

**For Personal Consideration Or Family Discussion:**

It took boldness- from God’s Spirit- for Jesus to announce in that synagogue filled with people who had watched him grow up, “I am the fulfillment of Scripture. I am the promised Savior Isaiah wrote about.” It takes boldness from the Spirit for us to confess before others that Jesus is the promised Savior. Why is that? What does the Spirit use to make us passionate about doing that, despite our fears?
